

# Methodology of SuM4All™

## Global Transport Stakeholder Mapping

The SuM4All Global Transport Stakeholder Mapping visualization tool aims to clarify who is who and who does what in the sustainable mobility arena. SuM4All aims to bring all organizations and agencies together to speak with one voice to make today's mobility equitable, efficient, safe and green.

The World Bank, with support from the [World Economic Forum](#), has mapped out global transport initiatives and organizations as comprehensively and systematically as possible. Starting in December 2016, we have been decoding the sector by gathering data on various types of organizations and initiatives through a systematic questionnaire. The questionnaires are administered to Academic Institutions, Bilateral Donors, Countries, Global Civil Society Organizations, Multilateral Development Banks, UN agencies, Programmers and Regional Commissions, Non-Governmental Organizations and Private Sector. Phase 1 of the exercise covers global initiatives. Our survey called for detailed input on several dimensions:

- Contact information
- What's your main objective and impact ambition of the initiative?
- Which deliverables or products does your initiative aim to achieve or produce?
- What region(s) do you focus on?
- Does your initiative focus on a specific country (or multiple countries)?
- What SDGs do you support?
- Does your organization or agency have a specific contribution to NDCs? If so, which NDCs are being impacted?

- What SuM4All objectives do your organization or agency affect or support?
- How often do you integrate gender considerations into your transport related work?
- Which other organizations and agencies do you partner with?

Users can search for organizations and agencies by SDGs, SuM4All objectives, regions, focus countries, sectors, and organization types. In the process of finalizing all information and data we collected, we made some validation work based on the information we collected in the questionnaire. By doing that, this stakeholder mapping tool will help users to easily search for organizations, to have a thorough understanding of what this organization does, and to better understand the connections and relationships among different projects, working groups and initiatives around the world.

According to the information we found on each organization and agency's introduction page on the webpage, we also added two other fields, sectors and organization type, as another useful option in the filter section. In terms of sectors, we use the [World Bank Sector Taxonomy](#) as our reference to define and categorize organizations and agencies into the following nine sectors.

- **Aviation**
- **Active Transport**
- **Automotive**
- **Urban Transport**
- **Railways**
- **Rural and Inter-Urban Road**
- **Maritime**
- **Multi-Modal**
- **Projected Oriented**

- **Other (such as vehicle technology and fuel, emission reduction)**

In terms of Organization type, we defined and put all organizations and agencies into the following eight main categories:

- **Academic Institutions**
- **Bilateral**
- **Global Civil Society Organizations**
- **Multilateral Development Banks**
- **UN agencies, Programmers and Regional Commissions**
- **Non-Governmental Organizations**
- **Private Sector**

Regarding to primary role, we developed four roles for now, which are:

- **Advocacy**
- **Industry Representation**
- **Implementation (Including Finance)**
- **Research**
