Proposed Meeting Format and Logistics

Overall

The meeting will be hosted by the World Bank via Webex. Simon Fowler (an independent consultant who has worked with the World Bank on events) will act as Master of Ceremonies.

The event will employ differing presentation and discussion formats to entertain, inform and engage the participants throughout the 3 hours duration. Specifically:

Session 1 – Viewpoint: COVID-19: Key Trends on Transport (10 mins)

Session 2 – The New Normal in Action (60 mins)
