Sustainable Mobility for All (SuM4All) is the premier advocacy platform for international cooperation on transport and mobility issues. Established in 2017, and hosted by the World Bank, the global, multi-stakeholder partnership, brings together more than 55 public organizations and private companies, including bilateral partners, multilateral development banks, U.N. organizations, inter-governmental organizations, and civil society with a shared ambition to transform the future of mobility.

SuM4All is an innovative model for action in transport. It leverages the knowledge, expertise, and influence of its Member organizations to assist countries worldwide in their ambition to attain the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and sustainable mobility. A recipient of several awards, SuM4All has established technical credibility in the international development community and legitimacy in the transport sector. It has successfully helped position transport at the forefront of the global development debate and the climate crisis through knowledge-sharing, advocacy, and technical assistance. By addressing glaring knowledge gaps in the sector and providing the tools for country engagement/decision-making, SuM4All is transforming the conversation on transport and the future of mobility.

Our Products and Tools

The **Global Mobility Report 2017 (GMR)** is the first-ever comprehensive assessment of the state of the Transport sector globally. It has become a go-to resources for understanding the global mobility landscape, the challenges and the opportunities for investment and stakeholder engagement.



The **Global Tracking Framework for Transport (GTF)** provides a comprehensive framework to diagnose transport and mobility issues based on data and evidence and quantify the gap between countries' actual performances and ambition. The newly created Global Sustainable Mobility Index score allows ranking 180 plus countries against universal access, efficiency, safety, and green mobility. Built-in 2017 and expanded in 2020, the GTF Transport Portal provides more relevant transport indicators with global data coverage accessible for free on the SuM4All website.



The **"Mobility at a Glance: Country Dashboards"** equips the international transport community with access to data of any countries' transport and mobility system in the world against sustainable mobility.



The **Global Roadmap of Action toward Sustainable Mobility (GRA)** of 2019 is the first global catalog of policy



measures available to policy-makers that provide specific guidance on achieving sustainable mobility. Complemented by six goal-specific policy papers and a private consultation paper, the GRA Report can help inform governments' investment and policy choices to achieve sustainable mobility based on data and evidence. An upgraded version, GRA 2.0, fully integrates the concept of the transport system's resilience to a global pandemic and extreme weather events in the algorithm to help decision-makers stay on track while recognizing the opportunities for sustainable mobility during a global or local disruption.

On-Line Decision-Making Tool on Sustainable Mobility is an



online interactive tool that provides countries and transport stakeholders with the information they need to measure sustainable mobility performances. It also enables users to create a prototype action plan for decision-making. SuM4All partners developed the in response to the need to help countries attain the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and transition toward sustainable mobility, defined by four policy goals: universal access, efficiency, safety, and green mobility.

Looking Ahead

SuM4All has established solid foundations to engage with countries on a comprehensive policy agenda for sustainable mobility since the successful release of GRA. For instance, in collaboration with the Development Bank of South Africa (DBSA) and the World Bank, SuM4All is piloting the GRA's use in South Africa to guide the decision-makers on future investment programs in the country and accelerate the progress of the SDGs.

The five workstreams of SuM4All is taking a deep dive into the catalog of policy measures from the GRA. Each workstream will focus on specific cutting-edge aspects of the transport agenda—gender, data framework, e-mobility, energy, and mobility nexus—that will significantly influence the sector's knowledge, work, and investments as a driver of solutions to the climate change crisis.
